We reserve the right to revoke, without notice or refund, credentials or access to Festival events and venues for those who engage in such conduct.

We have partnered with the Utah Attorney General's office to provide a 24-hour live hotline, which will open on January 12th, for those who are involved in or witness something that violates this Code of Conduct at 801-834-1944.

## **Film Etiquette**

All patrons attending a Sundance Film Festival screening must adhere to the following guidelines:

- The use of cameras or other recording equipment is strictly prohibited during the screening.
- Filmgoers should remember to take all personal belongings and litter with them as they exit. Any items left behind may be disposed of.
- The Sundance Film Festival reserves the right to search the personal belongings of any patron inside or around the premises of the theatres.
- Once inside the theatre, all cell phones and electronic devices must be turned off prior to the introduction of the film.
- All filmgoers agree to comply with all published and stated rules and regulations.

Additionally, students should be quiet, respectful, and limit their talking during the film to a minimum. Teachers and chaperones are expected to ensure that their students comply with these rules.

Debra Granik is the director and co-writer of *Winter's Bone* (2010 Sundance Film Festival), which starred Jennifer Lawrence and was nominated for four Academy Awards, including best picture and best adapted screenplay. Her first film, *Down to the Bone*, won Granik the U.S. Dramatic Directing Award at the 2004 Sundance Film Festival. Granik's 2014 film, *Stray Dog*, a feature documentary, aired on *Independent Lens* and was nominated for a Film Independent Spirit Award.

#### Artist Bio - Betsy West



Friendly professor at Columbia Journalism School.

#### Artist Bio - Julie Cohen

Julie Cohen has directed eight documentaries on various topics, including African opera singers (*Ndiphilela Ukucula: I Live to Sing*, New York Emmy winner, 2014), a legendary fish store (*The Sturgeon Queens*, 2015 Berlin International Film Festival), and a quadriplegic soldier (*American Veteran*, 2017).
